
Because of the success of her online book club, organizing an in-person book club was something she began to consider.

After sending out a survey to interested members, many of whom responded their top genres included contemporary fiction and autobiographies, Emelia chose Sue Monk Kidd's *The Invention of Wings* for the club's January meeting. The choice was also very practical, as there are 65 copies of the title available through the Columbus Metropolitan Library and it can be ordered online—new \$11 and used \$2. (There's really nothing like highlighting and making notes in your own copy of a book!) *The Invention of Wings* was selected as part of Oprah's Book Club 2.0 in January 2014. The Invention of Wings is a novel about the life of abolitionist and women's rights icon Sarah Grimke, told from alternating perspectives of Grimke and her slave, Hetty ("Handful"). Set in Charleston, South Carolina in the 1800s, both women find their lives restricted by the mores of the time and desire freedom. The novel is rich with themes and issues that find themselves relevant in the twenty-first century and is beautifully written by Kidd who, by using two narrators, tells an easy to read, compelling story, in a unique and meaningful way.

Curious Salem

"The Medallion Home of 5478 Crawford Drive"

The neighborhood now known as Salem was built over several decades, primarily from the 1940s to 1960s, and includes several developments. The homes along the east side of Sinclair Rd. were originally part of the "Indianola Acres" development (Sinclair Rd. was once an extension of Indianola Avenue), the west side was "Pencader." The south side of Strimple was developed as "Aven Gardens," and the area from the north side of Strimple through to Lincoln, was "Chaseland Manor." The area bounded by Darcy, Conant, Roche, and Hillery is the first development to be called "Salem," and Crawford and North Meadows were a separate development, known as "Northview Estates."

Northview Estates was developed by more than twenty different builders, with varying styles and designs, tailored to the needs of the buyer/client. To sell these homes, many builders built model homes for potential buyers to tour, then the buyers selected from available lots, home plans, and/or pre-built homes.

One of these model homes is located at 5478 Crawford Drive and was built by local builder Walter J. Shapter. Shapter was a well-known Columbus builder, with his Walmar Building Corp. (named after himself and his wife, Margaret: Wal+Mar) having developed parts of Bexley, Clintonville, Linden (Walmar Dr. is located in North Linden), Colonial Hills (now part of Worthington) and areas of Columbus's west side. Shapter was also founder of the "Rancho 961" Polo Club that used to be where the Continent is now located on Busch Blvd., with the horses' stables on the south side of 161, where Salem is now. As a



5478 Crawford Drive in Northview Estates

Perfect harmony , are the words to describe this one-floor California Ranch L-shaped house of antique brick and white painted Harborite with batten strips set in a wooded area of mature oak and hickory trees. A colonial decor, luxuriously designed by Mrs. Shapter, Jr., features (including the three bedrooms) fully carpeted living area with foam rubber padding. Vinyl tile is used on the floors in the den-family room, the kitchen, and the two baths.

Velvet enamelled trim and matching walls, with cinnamon cabinetry in a deluxe General Electric built-in kitchen, blend into the motif.

The den-family room with its antique brick hearth and facing of the fireplace, along with the stone mantel and mahogany panelled walls adds a further note to the harmony of the design.

The home has commodious wardrobes (none less than six ft. wide) for storage.


Large aluminum sliding doors in the dining area, along with a jalousied door in the den-family room overlook a large patio at the rear of the home.

All windows in the house are aluminum double-hung sash type, with marble sills.

For comfort, the wide overhang for winter protection is helped by the insulated overhead and side walls and a forced-draft ceiling fan in the hallway.

There is an attached garage - 20 x 20 ft, with an overhead electric-eye operated door.

This house containing an area of 1800 sq. ft. is situated on a lot 70 x 155 ft.

builder, Shapter built the first prefabricated home in Columbus, and built the shopping center at 161 and North Meadows across from Sheetz, which is still named "Shapter Shopping Center."

The home at 5478 Crawford Dr. was featured in the 1959 Home Builders' Association Parade of Homes (see image p. 7) and described as a "[p]erfect harmony...California Ranch." The Parade of Homes was (is still!) an annual event featuring model homes showcasing new construction homes at various price points, allowing interested buyers to tour the homes and discuss options with builders. Thousands attend the annual event, which has taken place for seventy vears.

The parade brochure noted several unique features of the home, including that it was "set in a wooded area of mature oak and hickory trees" and boasted "[v]elvet enamelled trim and matching walls, with cinnamon cabinetry in a deluxe General Electric built-in kitchen," "mahogany panelled walls," and

"commodious wardrobes (none less than six ft. wide)." Mrs. Shapter designed the interior.

After serving as a model home for several years, the house at 5478 Crawford was purchased by Catherine Horvath, who lived there with her daughter and widowed sister. After Mrs. Horvath died, daughter, Theresa, remained at the home until her death in 1996. Theresa was a lifelong employee of the A&P in Upper Arlington. After her death, the home sold in 1998, again in 2004 and 2013, and the current owner purchased the home in 2017.

Miss Horvath With A&P Firm 25 Years

Miss Theresa C. Horvath, of 5478 Crawford Dr., head cashier of the A&P Super Market on Tremont Rd., Upper Arlington, marked her 25th anniversary with the food firm Thursday.

She has frequently been assigned to checker-training and for a time served as office auditor. She received company recognition from H. T. Walsworth, general superintendent, and was enrolled in the A&P Quarter Century Club.






