NCC Report February 2023

- 2 suspects have been arrested for the robberies at several Dollar General stores in Northland.
- The City Attorney has filed a Nuisance Abatement suit against the Doll House on Karl Rd. due to two shootings in the last month and a variety of other violations. The suit seeks to have the business closed until they come into compliance with a proposed security agreement that includes significant requirements and upgrades for security measures in the building and parking lot.
- The Karl Rd. library will celebrate the Columbus Metropolitan Library's 150th birthday on Saturday, March 4th from 12-4pm with activities for all age groups. The Jazz Arts Group and Jazz Academy on Tour will also perform at 11am. Participants in activities can register to win a \$150 Target gift card.
- The Karl Rd. library has Neighborhood Social Workers from Columbus Public Health available on a walk-in basis on the first and third Tuesday of each month from 12:30-4:30pm to provide help with housing, employment, food, healthcare, addiction and recovery, applying for benefits and more.

- The year 2023 will come with many changes, including a new structure to City Council. When voters head to the polls on May 2, 2023, they'll notice their ballots will look different for Council candidates. We are moving from an at-large system to a hybrid at-large nine-district system. That includes expanding the Council body to nine members starting in 2024. Council is changing to improve neighborhood representation and reflect our growing population.
