- America's Best Value Inn on Sinclair Rd. did not meet the February deadline to pay outstanding fines and complete work on the third building so the City Attorney will be asking the court to issue a judgement against the owner and if the judgement is not satisfied the City Attorney will move for a hearing to have the property placed in receivership.
- The City of Columbus, in partnership with Ohio Means Jobs, will be hosting a career and resource fair. Activities will include Networking with City of Columbus department staff, Interactive mini-workshops, Career development tips, and Guidance and assistance with applying for jobs at the City of Columbus. The Resource Fair will be held on Saturday, April 6, 9 a.m. to 2 p.m., at the Jerry Hammond Center, 1111 E. Broad St, Columbus, OH 43205. - The deadline to challenge property values with the Franklin County Board of Revision (BOR) is rapidly approaching on April 1. - Mobile Produce Markets Begin April 4 to provide eligible families (200% or below the Federal Poverty Level) with a one-week supply of fresh produce at no cost. Held Thursdays and Fridays at select community centers across the City, these markets start at 2 p.m. and continue until supplies last. There is no need to verify eligibility at the market, just bring your ID and stock up on nutritious goodies provided by Mid-Ohio Food Collective (MOFC), which delivers the produce.
