NCC Report May 2024

- The Columbus Metropolitan Library Summer Reading Challenge will begin June 1<sup>st</sup>. The Karl Rd. branch Kickoff Party will run from 1:30-3:30pm.
- The Karl Rd. Library holds English Conversation Tables on Wednesdays from 3:00-4:00pm. Library staff explore a variety of topics and vocabulary through conversation. No registration required. All levels are welcome.
- Columbus Metropolitan Library Culture Passes are available for free for anyone with a library card. Organizations available include the Columbus Clippers, CAPA, Columbus Children's Theatre, Columbus Zoo and more. For information see: <https://www.columbuslibrary.org/culture-pass/>
- Northland Exposed is an exhibit showcasing fine art, photography, sculpture and performance and will take place June 2 from 11:00am-4:00pm at Elevate Northland, 4848 Evanswood Dr. This is the first art exhibit held in Northland in 30 years. - Walk With a Doc will happen at Woodward Park Community Center on June 1<sup>st</sup> at 9:00am.
- City Council has issued the proposed zoning code changes for designated corridors in the Zone In initiative. May NCC meeting included extensive discussion with staff from the Dept. of Building and Zoning regarding proposed elimination of required parking spaces, proposed allowed building height up to 12 stories, and effect of proposed changes leading to lack of formal input on parcel use from Community Councils and Area Commissions that represent area residents. The map of the designated corridors, proposed code changes, location of public gallery providing information, and public comment submission site can be found at: <https://zone-in-columbus.hub.arcgis.com/> The public comment period on the proposed changes is open until June 10<sup>th</sup>, 2024.
- LinkUS is Central Ohio's plan for transportation growth, including sidewalks, bike lanes, expanded trails, and increased COTA bus service. There will be a proposed ½ percent sales tax increase for COTA on the ballot this November to help fund this initiative.
