NCC Report July 2024

- The mayor's proposed Capital Improvement Budget has been released and public hearings held by City Council. The proposed budget can be viewed here: https://www.columbus.gov/Government/Departments/Finance-and-Management/BudgetManagement/2024-Operating-Budget
- The revised Final Draft of the Zone In zoning code changes has been released and there will be a final public hearing on July 24th in City Council Chambers at 5:30pm. City Council will vote on the language at the regular City Council meeting on July 29th. Information can be found here: https://zone-in-columbus.hub.arcgis.com/
- COTA will have a 0.75% sales tax measure on the November ballot to fund development of the COTA rapid transit plan that is part of LinkUs Columbus. 0.5% will be a new tax and 0.25% will replace a temporary tax that is set to expire in 2026. For information about the LinkUs plan to add rapid transit, bikeways, sidewalks and related infrastructure improvements see: https://linkuscolumbus.com/
- The City of Columbus and Franklin County have completed the first comprehensive study of the region's tree canopy and its changes from 2011 to 2021. The Tree Canopy Assessment measures the land covered by trees, highlighting changes and areas for potential planting. The findings will help prioritize, expand and grow our tree canopy, which is critical to address future population growth, development pressures, climate change and public health challenges. - Sustainable Columbus has received a \$1 million grant from the federal Climate Pollution
 Reduction Grant (CPRG) program. This money will be used to create a <u>Central Ohio Climate</u>

 low-income and disadvantaged communities and they are currently gathering input from
 residents across the 10-county region through a survey about community and climate needs,
