NCC Report February 2025

- CPD reports that car thefts continue to be high, especially around Easton, and there has been a spike in robberies in parking lots around Polaris.
- The process of adding the E161 corridor (parcels fronting on the north and south sides of E161) from the Worthington city line to Forest Hills Blvd. to the Phase 1 Zone In standards (Title 34 of the city code) will start the 60-day public comment period once City Council accepts the Mayor’s recommendation to do so – tentative date is the 3/10/25 city council meeting. Districts proposed for the E161 corridor are Regional Activity Center (RAC), Community Activity Center (CAC) and Urban General. - Columbus City Council offers paid internships year-round for junior or senior undergraduates and first-year graduate students enrolled in higher education programs. For Summer 2025, the internship will begin in May 2025 and end in July 2025. Interns are expected to work a minimum of 15 hours and up to 20 hours per week, and will be compensated \$17 per hour. Students selected for the program will be placed in the office of a Councilmember, Community Engagement, Communications, the City Clerk, or the Legislative Research Office in downtown Columbus. The deadline to apply for the Summer 2025 Internship is Friday, February 28, 2025. - The Franklin County Auditor's office, in conjunction with Franklin County Commissioners, has extended the deadline to license your dogs without penalty to February 28. The new deadline will enable dog owners who were busy or otherwise distracted to get their legally required dog license. The price of a license doubles after the February 28 deadline, per state law. Licenses may be purchased online at <https://doglicense.franklincountyohio.gov/> or at the Auditor's office license counter, 373 S. High St., 21st Floor in downtown Columbus. The counter is open Monday through Friday, from 8 am to 4 pm. Owners can also change addresses, download forms and update dog information using the online licensing system. In addition to being required by state law, dog licensing ensures that any lost dog is returned quickly to their owners. License fees help support the Franklin County Dog Shelter and Adoption Center.
