## NCC Report April 2025

- CPD reports that 4 cars were stolen from the Sheetz on 161/N meadows when the cars were left running while the driver went inside.
- The process of adding the E161 corridor (parcels on the north and south sides of E161) from the Worthington city line to Ponderosa Dr. to the Phase 1 Zone In standards (Title 34 of the city code) has begun and the 60-day comment period will run through May 10 th . To view and submit comments on the proposed map go to <https://zone-in-columbus.hub.arcgis.com/> Over 40 Salem residents living on Poste Lake organized by the Pencader Lake Association attended the April 14 th public hearing and submitted written and oral testimony recommending that the 6 currently single-family zoned parcels fronting on the lake be removed from this rezoning proposal, and that the commercial parcels between Sinclair Rd. and the railroad tracks be zoned as UG2 rather than CAC as proposed. New zoning rules for current single-family zoned parcels throughout the city will be addressed in future Zone In phases over the next several years.
- Earth Day Celebration will be held at the Woodward Park Community Center and Woodward Park Preserve (5147 Karl Rd., direct access from Salem via the bridge that crosses I71) on April 25 th from 9am-Noon.

- Franklin County, Ohio is in the process of preparing the 2025-2029 Consolidated Plan, 2025 Annual Action Plan, and Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing. The Consolidated Plan governs the activities to be funded with U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) funding, including Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME investment Partnerships Program (HOME), and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) dollars for the next five years. Franklin County receives an annual allocation of CDBG, HOME, and ESG dollars as a qualified entitlement community and these funds are used to meet priority housing and community development needs in the community. The Consolidated Plan will serve as a blueprint for the expenditures of federal funds in the County from April 1, 2025, through March 30, 2031. The public survey is open through May 5 th , 2025.
