NCC Report June 2025

- Next 161 Task Force Litter Clean Up is Saturday, July 12th. Meet at Jiffy Lube, 1800 E Dublin Granville Rd at 9am. Bags, high visibility vests, pickers are provided.
- The addition of the E161 corridor (parcels on the north and south sides of E161) from the Worthington city line to Ponderosa Dr. to the Phase 1 Zone In standards (Title 34 of the city code) was finalized by city council on June 9th, and will go into effect on July 9th. The six single family parcels on Poste Lake that were included in the initial map were removed from the final map approved by city council.
- The NCC Fourth of July parade will be held on Friday, July 4th from 10am-noon. Parade will go down Karl Rd. from Morse to 161. Residents are encouraged to bring chairs and observe the parade on Karl Rd. Anyone interested in bringing a group to march in the parade, or to volunteer see www.northlandparade.org.
- The city is in the process of revising section 709.03 (Noxious Weeds) of the city code to allow for front yard and curb strip plants higher than 12 inches if the plants are native or pollinator friendly plants. The definitions and lists of allowable plants have not been finalized yet.
- The Karl Rd. Library is a site for free breakfast (10:15-11:00am) and fresh food snack (3:30-4:15pm) Monday-Saturday for anyone 18 years old or younger.
- The Columbus Metropolitan Library annual Book Festival will be July 12th and 13th at the Main Library on Grant Ave. Workshops, author readings, books sales, food carts and family events will be included. For info and schedules see: <https://www.columbusbookfestival.org/>
